

1. **anarchy** the absence of laws and government
2. **customary law** principles and procedures that have developed according to the customs of a people or nation and are treated as obligatory
3. **customs** collective habits or traditions that have developed in a society over a long period of time
4. **equality** the state or quality of being equal; having the same rights or status
5. **ethics** rules or standards governing the conduct of a person or the members of a profession
6. **fairness** free from bias, dishonesty or injustice
7. **justice** the legal principle of upholding generally accepted rights and enforcing responsibilities, ensuring that equal outcomes are achieved for those involved
8. **law** a set of rules imposed on all members of a community which are officially recognised, binding and enforceable by persons or organisations such as the police and/or courts
9. **legal system** the system of courts, prosecutors and police in a country
10. **natural justice** the body of principles used to ensure the fairness and justice of the decision-making procedures of courts; also known as procedural fairness
11. **rule of law** the principal that no one is above the law
12. **rules** regulations or principles governing procedure or controlling conduct
13. **tyranny** rule by a single leader holding absolute power in a nation-state
14. **values** principles, standards, or qualities considered worthwhile or desirable within a society
