Claudius Reform 1	celebrated the Secular Games in AD 47
Claudius Reform 2	added provincials (Gauls) into the Senate
Claudius Reform 3	initiated public works such as the harbour at Ostia

extended the imperial bureaucracy, improving administration by creating separate departments

Claudius Reform 5

passed just and humane laws

Claudius Reform 6

invaded Britain

Claudius Reform 7

extended citizenship to individuals and communities

Claudius Reform 8

restored aspects of state religion

Claudius Reform 9

outlawed the druid religion in Gaul

Claudius Reform 10

tried to solve problem between the Greeks and the Jews in Alexandria

Nero Reform 1

abolished capital punishment (later reinstated)

Nero Reform 2

allowed slaves to take legal action against their masters

Nero Reform 3

had a statue of himself depicted as the sun god set up in his Golden Palace

Tiberius Reform 1	limited expenses, generous aid given to provinces
Tiberius Reform 2	developed a new road system in Spain and Gaul
Tiberius Reform 3	discharged corrupt officials in disgrace
Tiberius Reform 4	kept efficient governors in office for long periods
Tiberius Reform 5	concentrated the Praetorian Guard into one barrack
