a statement of
basic human rights
and privileges

implied rights

civil and political rights that
can be inferred from the
Constitution, rather than
being expressly stated

political autonomy

self-determination,
independence

responsibilities

legal or moral
obligations to
others

rights

legal or moral
entitlements or
permissions

self-determination

the right to determine one's own acts without external influence

self-executing

the idea that a treaty becomes binding as soon as the treaty has been ratified

tortious

wrongful; constituting a tort or breach of duty to others
