
1. psychologist	a person who specialises in the study of the human mind
2. raga	to lust and desire for something
3. reconciliation	the act of reconciling or forgiving; making up after a period of estrangement
4. redemption	the act of saving something, or redeeming its worth by bringing it back
5. regimen	a prescribed course of study or exercise
6. renegade	someone who rebels against something, especially a religious belief; an apostate
7. sadducees	a Jewish sect at the time of Jesus
8. sanctuary	an identified holy place such as a church or temple, or the central parts of a building
9. satyagraha	the policy of passive resistance as a means of pressing for political reform
10. sutras	scriptural narratives and texts which are traditionally regarded as a discourse of the Buddha
11. tenakh	the Hebrew Bible
12. theology	the science of studying religion, usually Christian
13. topography	the natural frames of a landscape, including the trees, rivers, mountains etc.
14. tribulation	is sorrow, suffering, trials
15. upanishad	a group of philosophical commentaries contributing to the theology of ancient Hinduism, elaborating on the earlier Vedas
16. vicissitudes	changes of fortune and circumstance
17. vigilante	a person who keeps a careful watch for perceived wrongdoings in the sense of seeking to maintain order
18. yatra	the Hindu term for pilgrimage
19. zionist	a believer in the re-establishment of the Jewish state of Israel
