| 1. <b>complainant</b>             | a person alleging that a sexual assault has been committed against him or her  |
| 2. <b>conciliation</b>            | a method of legal dispute resolution involving a third party who helps the parties to reach agreement                                      |
| 3. <b>consent</b>                 | free and voluntary agreement by a rational person who is able to understand and make a decision about the matter to which he or she agrees |
| 4. <b>contempt of court</b>       | words or actions that show a disregard for the authority of the court or interfere with its powers   |
| 5. <b>dispossession</b>           | the removal or expulsion of people from their traditional lands  |
| 6. <b>express consent</b>         | consent given directly, either oral or written   |
| 7. <b>in camera</b>               | privately; only specified persons such as the judge can be present during the testimony or proceeding                                      |
| 8. <b>martial law</b>             | military government and laws imposed on civilian society, which overrides civil law  |
| 9. <b>native title</b>            | the right of indigenous people to their traditional lands  |
| 10. <b>nomadic</b>                | people who tend to travel and change settlements frequently  |
| 11. <b>pastoralists</b>           | farmers raising sheep or cattle, usually on large areas of land  |
| 12. <b>sexual assault</b>         | a general term for criminal offences involving unwanted sexual contact   |
| 13. <b>sponsorship</b>            | the support of an individual, event, or organisation financially or through the provision of products and services                         |
| 14. <b>tort law</b>               | the body of law that deals with civil wrongs including negligence, defamation, trespass and nuisance                                       |
| 15. <b>trespass to the person</b> | a tort involving direct contact with a person's body without that person's consent   |
| 16. <b>vicarious liability</b>    | the legal liability imposed on one person or agent (e.g. an employer) for the wrong acts of another  |
