1. <b>epitaph</b>	inscription on a tomb, honouring the deceased
2. <b>equestrian</b>	seated on a horse
3. <b>extinct</b>	a permanently inactive volcano; or one that has not erupted in known memory
4. <b>fauces</b>	a narrow hallway
5. <b>forum</b>	open space in a town, surrounded by public buildings; the focus of religious, administrative, commercial and judicial affairs
6. <b>freedmen</b>	former slaves who had gained their freedom, many of whom were successful in business
7. <b>fresco</b>	a painting done on the damp plaster of walls
8. <b>genius</b>	the guardian spirit of a person or place
9. <b>gilded</b>	covered with a thin layer of gold or gold paint
10. <b>impluvium</b>	a pool or basin to collect water
11. <b>inactive</b>	a dormant volcano; one that could resume activity at any time
12. <b>infant exposure</b>	the practice of leaving babies, usually girls, outside to die of exposure or be taken as slaves
13. <b>in situ</b>	in the original position
14. <b>insula</b>	a block of buildings defined by streets on all sides
15. <b>lares</b>	guardian spirits, of households and crossroads
16. <b>libation</b>	liquid poured as an offering to gods or spirits of the dead
17. <b>loggia</b>	an upper porch
18. <b>lovage</b>	a herb similar in taste to celery
19. <b>manumission</b>	the act of freeing someone from slavery
20. <b>mosaic</b>	a floor or wall picture made up of thousands of tiny pieces of coloured stone, tile or glass
21. <b>municipium</b>	originally an Italian community given a form of Roman citizenship, without the right to vote until after the Social War
22. <b>necropolis</b>	a cemetery
23. <b>oecus</b>	a family room
